ORIENTATION OF WORK AND AREAS OF INTEREST:

Archaeology and culture history of ancient Mexico and Central America, particularly in the Basin of Mexico and the Teotihuacan Valley, Classic and Aztec periods (ca. A.D. 1150 to 1521). Interpreting material culture remains – objects, sites, settlement and land use patterns -- requires a holistic and culture-ecological perspective, considering all significant aspects of cultural adaptation, from hydrology and agriculture to ritual practices, as lived by the ancient Indigenous peoples, from tenant farmers in their huts to lords in their palaces.

Only once, for this book, has the Society for American Archaeology conferred its Book Award on a full treatment of the pre-modern evolution of one of the world's great "cradles of civilization" (that is, regions where cities first arose). 1st edition won in 2005
- **Woman-Palace (Cihuatécpán)** was an Aztec village in the Teotihuacan Valley, small but so rich in archaeological evidence, including the only complete Aztec palace (técpán) ever excavated in the Basin of Mexico, substantial artifact repertoire, and maguey farming practices.
- **palace architecture and dynastic histories**, including landscape design, monumental gardens, and elite goods; the parallel worlds of the Cúlhua Mexíca and their European counterparts such as the Tudors
